What are cookies?

Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to your device when you visit a website. Cookies are then sent back to the originating website on each subsequent visit, or to another website that recognises that cookie (third party cookie). They are used by us to help our users navigate this website efficiently and perform certain functions. Due to their core role of enhancing or enabling usability or site processes, disabling cookies may prevent users from using certain parts of this website. Why am I suddenly being warned about cookies?

Although cookies have been used for years, the EU announced a change in the law that on the 26th May 2012 websites must inform visitors that cookies are collected and for what purpose.

What information is collected and stored by www.nicholloils.com?

Cookies are used to store information on how you navigate the webpage, i.e., what link has been clicked. This information is sent to our Google Analytics and we use insights from this to improve navigation of the webpage, making it more user friendly for you.

No Third-Party Cookies are stored or created.

How can I stop cookies from being stored on my computer?
